The first of our three sites, <u>Travelers' Rest State Park</u> is home to the only archaeologically verified campsite of the Lewis and Clark Expedition, and is also an important cultural site of the Salish and other indigenous people. Participants will enjoy a guided tour provided by Park staff along a relatively flat < 1.0 mile trail, and time to visit the interpretive center and museum at one's own pace. Opportunities to bird in the riparian area, wander through the gift shop which sells locally made crafts by Native Americans, and enjoy a boxed picnic lunch round out our first stop.

Adjacent to the State Park, the <u>Holt Heritage Museum</u> contains a rich collection of Old West artifacts and original art. The stories of cowboys' lives, told with displays of their tools and equipment, share space with numerous items from Montana's earliest settlements. The collection also includes historical interpretations of the Salish, Kootenai, Nez Perce, and Crow Tribes' daily lives. The Museum is privately owned by the Holt family and represents 35 years of dedication to telling the story of the Old West by Bill and Ramona Holt. Participants will tour the Museum at everyone's own pace.

We'll end our afternoon at the award-winning <u>Lolo Creek Distillery</u> where we'll enjoy craft cocktails and mocktails while relaxing with friends in the picturesque setting showcased from the Distillery's tasting room and outdoor patio.
